The heart of Christmas

We're at that time of year again! But is Christmas just about the shopping, tree or presents? At its heart, Christmas is all about a God who has showed up on earth. The Creator of the universe, whose hands flung stars into space, cared enough to come to earth as a tiny baby.

'The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us.' (John 1:14)

Every year we sing carols and retell the same story of the donkey, innkeeper, stable, angels, shepherds, star, wise men, gifts and Mary and Joseph with baby! Why do we do all this? It's to remind us that God deals with the mess of our world by sending His Son to die in our place. This makes it possible for us to have a relationship with Himself:

When the time came, He "did not consider equality with God something to be used to His own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to death – even death on a cross! (Philippians 2:6-8)

Reflecting on Jesus in the manger is a great place to start understanding the heart of the Christmas message. However, it's so much more than simply a cute baby lying in the bed of straw:

If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator; If our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist; If our greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist; If our greatest need had been pleasure, God would have sent us an entertainer; But our greatest need was forgiveness, so God sent us a Saviour.

Holy Land

I have written articles for a church magazine for over 20 years and I have studiously avoided topics which are topical or political/ contentious. In reality a bit like 'In Our Time' on Radio 4, where the experts, under forensic examination by Melvin Bragg, can talk about anything as long as it has no relevance to life today. But on Sunday the 5th November our minister treated us to "the most difficult words that I have ever tried to deliver". It was at the height of the Israeli bombardment of Gaza and the protest marches were growing in size in cities around the UK. How to make a Christian sense of the inhumanity that was visible to all, perpetrated by both sides in this unbelievably brutal conflict".

The Old Testament reading was, coincidentally, from Micah Ch. 3 verses 5-12 which are headed 'Leaders and Prophets rebuked', which talked about "the prophets who lead my people astray". I have no intentions of trying to compress a very powerful sermon into the 500 or so words of my contributions to Contact. Sufficient to say that the current situation is not God's way because humanity only achieves its best when it is inclusive to all.

Then we sang these famous words, which no doubt contributed to Dylan's Nobel Prize.

How many years can some people exist? before they're allowed to be free? And how many times can a man turn his head, pretending he just doesn't see? And how many times must the cannonballs fly before they're forever banned? *The answer, my friend, is blowin' in the wind, the answer is blowin' in the wind.*

As is inevitable with politics and the modern news cycle since then we have moved on. The Home Secretary has tried to put down a marker suggesting that all of those who protest at the treatment of Palestinian refugees are somehow condoning the violence. And at the same time the Chief Medical Officer has warned of looming crisis with the health of older people. That the wonders of their lengthening life will be overshadowed by the problems of premature aging and infirmity especially in rural and seaside communities. In truth just different bad news stories, which have contributed to, for the first time in my life an avoidance of the news cycle, because I just feel overwhelmed.

When I was a teenager, I had a predilection for science fiction stories. I remember very few of them in detail, with one or two notable exceptions, Arthur C Clarke, Rendezvous with Rama, 2001 a space Odyssey and Isaac Asimov who wrote the 'I Robot' stories. But for some reason I do remember the outline of a short story about a man who was detained in a secure hospital because he believed he was the ruler of the world. The set out a short period of this man's life, but went into great detail about how those who looked after him really only had one aim, how to support him in his delusions. When the senior nurse was asked, at the end of the story, why the patient was supported in this way the reply was "how can we not do this, because how civilised we are is judged by the way we treat such people". Jesus teaches us that humanity is at its best when it believes that the greatest of us must be humble and approach life through the eyes of a child. That he came that we might have life in all its fullness. That he loves us in the way we must love one another.

Because when love goes, hope fails. Hope is amongst all of the current bad news and we hope and pray that somehow, one day, peace will come.

The story behind 'The Night Before Christmas'

It was 200 years ago this Christmas, on 23rd December 1823, that the famous poem 'The Night Before Christmas' was first published (anonymously) in the Sentinel newspapers in Troy, New York.

It was light-hearted and full of fun, and not at all what you might have expected from its author, Clement Clarke Moore.

For Moore had been born in 1779 into a prominent New York family. His father, Benjamin Moore, the Episcopal bishop of New York, had even taken part in the inauguration of George Washington as the nation's first president.

As for Clement Moore, he was a scholar of Hebrew and a professor of Oriental and Greek literature at the General Theological Seminary in Manhattan.

But on 24th December 1822, the night that Moore composed the poem, he was traveling home from Greenwich Village. He had gone there to buy a turkey, in order to fill the last of a number of baskets that his family donated to the poor during the Christmas season.

Perhaps Moore was inspired by the plump, bearded Dutchman who took him by 'taxi' sleigh on his mercy errand through the snow-covered streets of New York City that night. But whatever it was, Moore scribbled down 'A Visit from St. Nicholas' for the amusement of his own six children, to whom he read the poem when he got home that evening. His description of St Nicholas drew upon the Dutch-American and Norwegian traditions of a magical, gift-giving figure who appears at Christmas time.

The following year, Christmas 1823, the poem was made public, without his permission. Moore was said to have been at first embarrassed to be named as the author of such a light-hearted verse, and then astonished by its quick rise to popularity. He finally published it under his own name in 1844.

...But I heard him exclaim, ere he drove out of sight, "Merry Christmas to all, and to all a good night."

Father Christmas

Of course, I had expected that by the age of seven it was inevitable that my son would begin to have serious thoughts about Father Christmas.

Sure enough, one day near Christmas he suddenly said: "Mum, I know something about Father Christmas, the Easter Bunny and the Tooth Fairy."

Taking a deep breath, I asked him what that might be.

"Easy," he said, "They are all nocturnal."

You are bound to sing about donkeys this Christmas, especially the little one that carried Mary to Bethlehem! But how much do you know about donkeys? They are really rather special.

Here are some fun facts:



There are more than 44 million donkeys in the world, of all shapes and sizes.

There are more than 186 breeds of donkey.

Donkeys have good memories. They can remember places and other donkeys even 25 years after they last saw them. Donkeys are not stubborn, they are cautious. If they are fearful about something, they will do their best to avoid it.

Donkeys are naturally clean. Given the chance, they are always grooming themselves and each other.

Donkeys like to be warm and dry. They come from deserts and savannahs.

Donkeys are social. They make deep bonds with their family and herd and get very upset if someone they love is taken from them.

Donkeys have big ears for a good reason – it means they can hear each other at a great distance. They communicate by braying, grunting, whiffling, squealing and snorting.

Donkeys help the ecology of their desert homes by digging into the ground to access water. This provides little creatures such as birds and chipmunks with life-saving water.



An Invitation to Stand with Palestinian Christians this Advent and Christmas

Our Christian colleagues in Bethlehem tell us that this Advent and Christmas in Bethlehem the lights that normally adorn the birthplace of Jesus will remain unlit in memory of those who have been killed in the current conflict. The Patriarchs and Heads of Churches in Jerusalem have noted that the traditional festive services in the Holy Land will be somber in nature due to the ongoing war.

The second candle on the Advent Ring represents peace, and in some traditions is known as the 'Bethlehem candle'. This Advent, we invite Methodist churches across the United Kingdom to do something 'out of the ordinary' and not to light the Advent Candle on the second Sunday in Advent (10 December) and on subsequent Sundays.

The Old Testament lectionary reading for 10 December starts with the words "Comfort, comfort my people says your God" (Isaiah 40:1). As such, it seems appropriate that we take this opportunity to think about Bethlehem and those who have been killed and those who are seeking comfort as they mourn. This unlit candle will serve as a constant reminder that we stand in solidarity with all who are suffering in the Holy Land.

The Stewards have agreed that this would be a good idea and we will observe this practise during our lighting of the advent candles - ed

Silent Night

It was the night before Christmas 1818, in the little village of Oberndorf, Austria. Joseph Mohr, the vicar, had just read the Christmas passage from Luke chapter 2, when a few verses inspired by the reading came into his mind. It would be pleasant, he thought, if they could be used at the Christmas Eve service, and so he called on the organist and handed him the verses.

Franz Gruber, the organist, thereupon composed a tune to which the verses could be sung and that was how one of the greatest Christmas carols - Silent Night - was created.


That evening, the organ broke down but, not to be outdone, the vicar and the organist sang the hymn as a duet. There the story might have ended had it not been for the organ. When the instrument had been repaired, the organist sat down to test it and played the tune composed by Gruber. He liked it and asked for a copy, which he took back to his home town. There a ladies' choir added it to their repertoire and it was included when they sang in other towns as well.

Gradually it became known by more and more people and it increased in popularity until today it must surely be the most frequently sung Christmas carol. Moreover, it is sung, not only in the language in which it was first written, but it has been translated into others too, so that, all over the world, people are united at Christmas in singing Silent Night in their own language.
